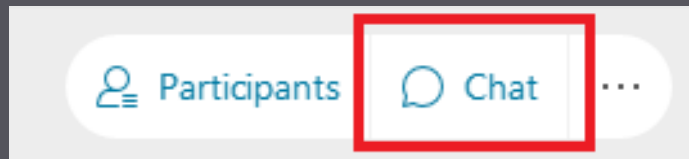

PAYROLL REQUIREMENTS

- **Prevailing wage contract**
- **All contractors on the project must be registered with the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR)**
- **State Funded only project**
- **Certified payroll records must be submitted through LCPtracker Pro (certified payroll internet system)**

PAYROLL REQUIREMENTS (CONT.)

- STATE WAGE DETERMINATIONS
 - ▶ Department of Industrial Relations 2021-2 general prevailing wage determinations
 - ▶ <https://www.dir.ca.gov/OPRL/DPreWageDetermination.htm>
 - ▶ Wages may increase during life of contract. Check for predetermined increases.
 - ▶ Check for shift differentials if there is night work.
 - ▶ Overtime pay for hours worked in excess of 8 hours in a calendar day.
 - ▶ Saturday/Sunday rates may also apply.

DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES (DVBE)

- **DVBE Contract goal 0%, DVBE use is encouraged.**

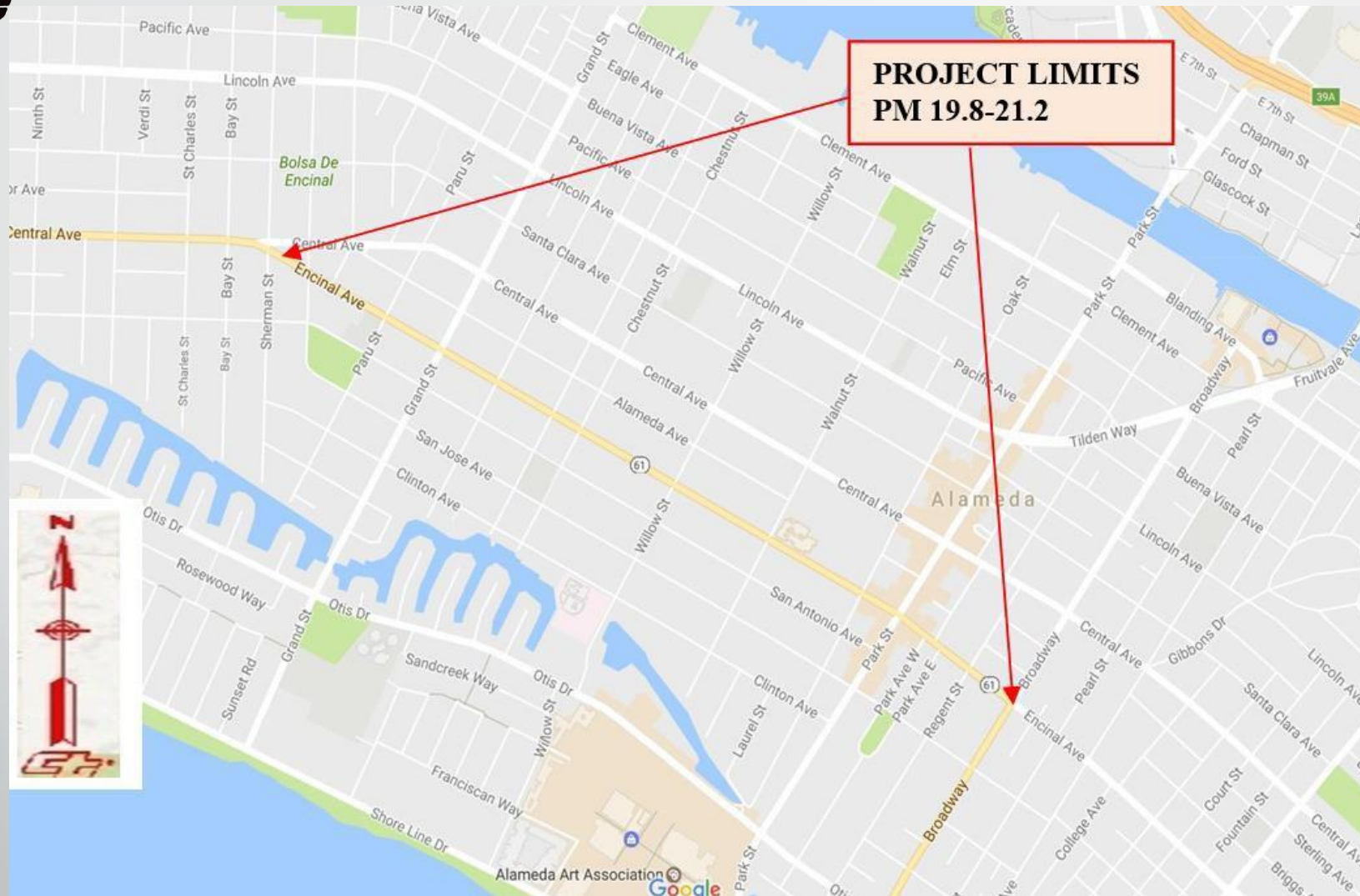

Project Information

- The project mainly consists of cold planning an existing pavement and overlaying it with rubberized hot mix asphalt, repairing localized failed asphalt concrete pavement, and upgrading curb ramps at 48 existing locations to current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standard.
- Project Cost Estimate = \$5,600,000
- The Contractor must have either a Class A license or the following Class C License which constitutes a majority of work: C-10, C-12
- No DVBE contract goal, but bidders encouraged to obtain DVBE participation

Project Scope

- Pavement Rehabilitation: Cold plane 0.25 foot AC, and overlay with 0.15 foot RHMA-G, Geosynthetic Paving Interlayer (Paving Mat), 0.10 foot of HMA-A
- Upgrade 48 blended transition curb ramps to ADA compliant standards
- Road Diet (lane configuration) to incorporate Complete Street elements
- Install vehicle speed feedback signs (VSFS)
- Upgrade crosswalk markings
- Upgrade signals to include APS and pedestrian countdown timers

 - Start construction: March 2022
 - Complete the work within 250 working days
